Wildhorse Resort & Casino will host an exciting and danceable entertainment lineup in its new Wildfire Cabaret in June, opening with the varied musical styles of the Triple Tribute June 7-9. Open just one month, the cabaret has listened to customer requests and moved the opening and closing to one hour later. Each weekend's live entertainment runs

from 7 p.m.–11 p.m. Thursday and 8 p.m.–midnight Friday and Saturday, with three one-hour shows and half-hour breaks. There is no cover charge.

In addition to foot tapping music, the Wildfire Cabaret serves beer, wine, cocktails, delicious appetizers and light meals.

Upcoming acts include:

Triple Tribute, June 7-9

Linda Ronstadt, the Eagles and Bob Seger have played concerts together so it seems appropriate that this Triple Tribute covers the music of all three of these outstanding acts. Like A Rock, starring Terry Jayo, brings to life such Seger hits as *Hollywood Nights*, *Night Moves*, *Fire Down Below* and more. The Reno-based band, FastLane, injects the sizzle into the Eagles much loved harmonies, from *Tequila Sunrise* and *Hotel California* to *Witchy Woman* and *New Kid in Town*. Finally, Tracy Bing revives Linda Ronstadt tunes—*It's So Easy*, *Blue Bayou*, *You're No Good*, *Heatwave* and more.

Nathan Owens' Sounds of Motown, June 14-16

The sounds of such soul artists as the Temptations, the Jackson Five, Sly and the Family Stone and Marvin Gaye all come to the stage with Nathan Owen's Sounds of Motown, a six-piece band from the Bay Area. Under group leader Owens, the band has opened for B.B. King, Kool and the Gang, Sevie Wonder, Jay Leno and others in such haunts as Reno, Lake Tahoe and Las Vegas.

Chris Guenther, June 21-23

For authentic country music it doesn't get better than Chris Guenther's unique blend of country, Texas swing and honky tonk. Although he grew up in rural Washington, his tunes have made it on the charts of the European Country Music Association. Asked why he plays most of the instruments on his three albums, including six of nine instruments on the second of his three disks, his response was "Why would I want to turn my vision over to someone else" and he described that vision as "raw, intense and poetic". Nonetheless, he tours with his band, the Honky Tonk Drifters.

Nitecrew, June 28-30

For hard-driving rock to the latest pop, Seattle's Nitecrew is one of the Pacific Northwest's best bands. The band features founders Jim Brammer, guitarist, and Jeff Wade, drums, with Virginia on vocals and several instruments and Tim "TC" Collier on the keyboard and vocalizing. Their songlist is huge, ranging from tunes made popular by Outkast to Pink, Madonna to Britney, and Bobby Brown to 50 Cent.
